

OPERATION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES



1. THE WARDEN REPORTS ON CASUALTIES AT THE INCIDENT.
2. THE CONTROL CENTER ORDERS THE MEDICAL FIELD UNIT OF THE HOSPITAL TO THE CASUALTY STATION NEAREST THE INCIDENT.
3. THE CASUALTY STATION, IF CLOSE TO THE INCIDENT, SERVES AS FIRST AID POST— OTHERWISE, MEDICAL TEAMS HEADED BY DOCTORS ARE SENT FORWARD TO SET UP ADVANCED FIRST AID POSTS TO WHICH AMBULANCES CAN APPROACH.
4. STRETCHER TEAMS CARRY THE INJURED TO THE FIRST AID POST FROM WHICH THEY ARE TRANSPORTED TO
5. THE CASUALTY RECEIVING HOSPITAL AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THE SLIGHTLY INJURED GO TO
6. THE CASUALTY STATION FOR TEMPORARY CARE UNTIL THEY CAN RETURN HOME OR GO TO TEMPORARY SHELTERS. AT OR NEAR THE CASUALTY STATION ARE
7. A MEDICAL SUPPLY DEPOT AND A CANTEN SERVICE STATION.
8. FROM THE CASUALTY RECEIVING HOSPITAL, THE INJURED CAN LATER BE EVACUATED TO AN EMERGENCY BASE HOSPITAL IN A SAFE RURAL AREA.
