

FEES AN OREGON NOTARY MAY CHARGE

Fees Dictated by Statute:

Traditional notarizations:

You may charge up to \$10 per act

RON notarizations:

You may charge up to \$25 per act

Unregulated Fees:

Travel fees:

Travel fees are not specified in Statute, so here are some best practices:

- Keep them reasonable so that customers will be willing to pay
- Keep them consistent so that you cannot be accused of being biased
- Make them public in advance of agreeing to perform any notarization

Other unregulated fees:

It is permissible to charge fees for services such as photocopying, but you should apply the same practices as you would for charging travel fees.

REMEMBER! FOR ANY AND ALL FEES YOU CHARGE, YOU MUST:

- Conform to statute if the fee is dictated by statute
- Charge fees consistently so that you maintain impartiality
- Make your fees public in advance of all notarizations; customers have a right to know what they will be charged before they commit to a notarization
